Dončić vs. Mavericks: Blockbuster Trade Fuels Record-Breaking Showdown

Tuesday night's clash between the Los Angeles Lakers and Dallas Mavericks was more than just another regular-season matchup—it was a spectacle fueled by drama, history, and a trade that shook the NBA to its core. And fans were glued to their screens.
